## From Where Does Courage Come? 1 Kings 16:29-17:6

In the ever-increasing environment in which we live, it seems to stand up for Biblical truth and faith are in short supply. Today we begin a sermon series based on the prophet Elijah who served God with extreme courage.
Elijah's ministry began at a pathetic, in the history of God's people.
