After defining living a godly life as in the, John speaks to our doubts about our salvation. He concludes that we struggle with assurance of salvation when we live in ways that are with God's way of life revealed in Jesus.
But John isn't talking about walking in the light <i>so that</i> we can be saved. Salvation is provided as a of God when anyone chooses to in Jesus and His death on the cross as God's provision for our sins. You can't or deserve it. But how you live can impact whether you or not.
John notes that people who fall out of, usually due to sinful behaviors, thoughts, or attitudes, often doubt their salvation. In the fellowship we are Together, we pray, praise, serve, and hear the word taught and preached. Our confidence in our relationship to God
John then offers another behavior that is crucial if we want to have a sense of assurance of our salvation: of sins. Walking in the light alone cannot sustain our sense of assurance since we are all, and we will never be completely from sin.
So, what can we do if we can't walk in the light perfectly? We can confess our sins. The word "confess" means to "say the as" God. When we acknowledge our sinful behaviors to God, he assures us in our spirit by that the blood of Jesus has and continues to us from all unrighteousness.
